Our children's programs are available to child care providers. They are intended to introduce young people to the Huble family, the Huble Homestead, and the history of the area through interactive activities.

Pioneer Kids

Homestead Life



A five hour program designed to fit into a summer day camp schedule and offers children the chance to experience pioneer life.



Children are briefly introduced to the Huble family, and will spend the day learning about pioneer life through a variety of games and activities.

- **Pioneer Chores** — Children get their hands dirty by performing tasks such as laundry the old-fashioned way, watering the garden, and emptying the chamber pots!
- **Animals** — Visit with the animals of the homestead.
- **Heritage Activities & Crafts** — Groups will do a pioneer activity with staff, and create a craft to take home.
- **Games** — Children will take part in old-fashioned games and races, as well as play the Homestead Game, which is designed to educate youth about pioneers! *Customized for younger children.*
- **Costumes** — If desired, costume pieces can be provided to the participants.

This program is led by Huble Homestead staff, with staff of the booking organizations on hand to assist in supervision.



Cost: \$8.00 per child

Supervisors and chaperones are free.

Length: 5 hours

Groups receive a 30 minute break for lunch.

Time: 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM

Arrival and departure time can be customized.

Pioneer Kids

Fun With Food

A five hour program designed to fit into a summer day camp schedule and educates children about pioneer food skills.

Children are briefly introduced to the Huble family, and will spend the day learning about how pioneers acquired and prepared food.

- **Animals** — Feed the animals of the homestead while discussing how they functioned as food sources.
- **Gathering** — Children participate in a scavenger hunt around the site to find the ingredients needed for a food-related activity.
- **Heritage Food** — Participants work together to make a food item that will then be sampled by all. *Can be customized to account for food allergies.*
- **Gardening** — Children will pick fruits or vegetables from the garden, learn about the root cellar, and more!
- **Bartering** — Groups will trade items at the General Store to earn they money needed to make ice cream!
- **Costumes** — If desired, costume pieces can be provided to the participants.

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Pioneer Kids

Pioneer Toys & Games



A five hour program designed to fit into a summer day camp schedule and offers children the opportunity to participate in pioneer fun.

Children are briefly introduced to the Huble family, and will spend the day learning how pioneers had fun through games and activities.

- **Huble Children** — Discover stories and information about the Huble children, visit their bedrooms, and learn about the toys they would have used.
- **Pioneer Toys** — Children get a chance to play with a variety of old-fashioned toys, from yo-yos to Jacob's Ladders.
- **Old-Fashioned Games** — Groups will be introduced to parlour games, participate in races, and learn how to play few different heritage games.
- **Scavenger Hunt** — Explore the homestead by finding items and working as a team.
- **Crafts** — Create a variety of pioneer toys to take home.
- **Costumes** — If desired, costume pieces can be provided to the participants.

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Supervisors and chaperones are free.

Length: 5 hours

Groups receive a 30 minute break for lunch.

Time: 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM

Arrival and departure time can be customized.

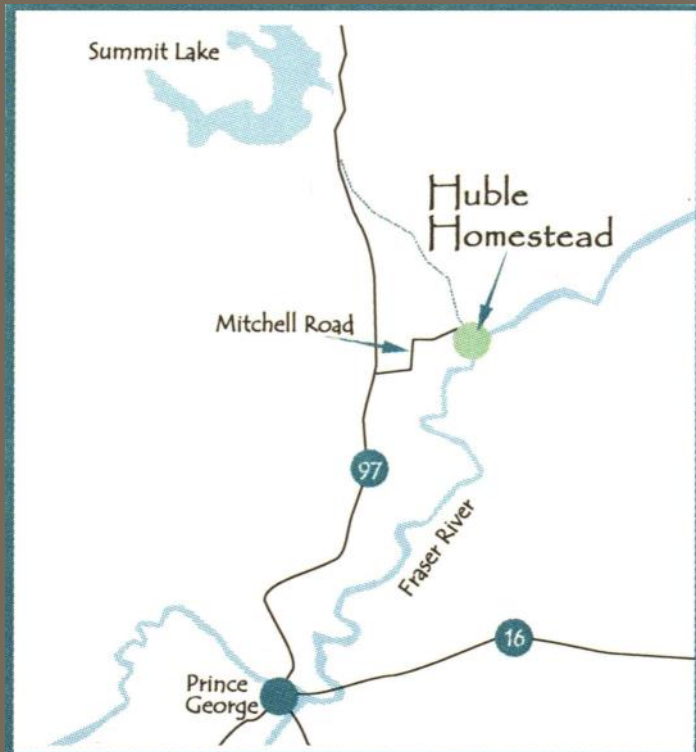
All supplies and materials for the Pioneer Kids packages are provided by Huble Homestead.
